

OUR COMPANY SUPPORTS IMMIGRANTS

Our company has a strong commitment supporting the human rights of immigrants. In light of ICE (Immigration & Customs Enforcement) raids and check-points taking place in parts of Los Angeles, it is important to know your rights.

1. If you are detained by ICE or any other law enforcement officer you have a right to call your nation's consulate. Even if they tell you that you are not under arrest you should exercise this right. Immediately tell any law enforcement officer who arrests you "I want to contact the consulate of my nation under Article 36(b) of the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations and Section 834c of the Penal Code. I have a right to telephone the consulate and you are required to notify the consulate of my detention. I refuse to answer any questions without a lawyer and without consular representation."

3. If ICE comes to your home DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR UNLESS THEY SHOW YOU A WARRANT.
4. If possible, RECORD OR VIDEOTAPE any contact you have with ICE or any other law enforcement. If you use Facebook, LIVESTREAM the incident on Facebook so that your friends can witness and know what's happening to you.
5. Call your supervisor. If your rights have been violated we will take action in conjunction with the California League of Latinos And Chicanos (CALLAC).
